

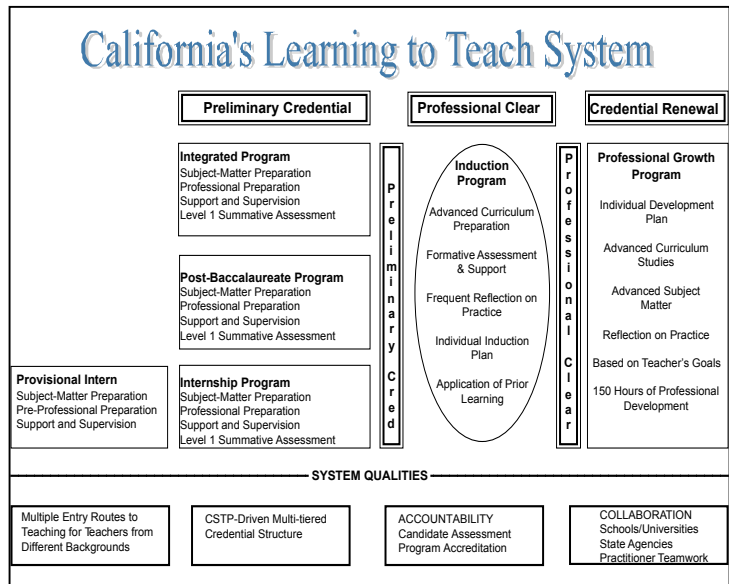


North Coast Teacher Induction Program

CATEGORIES OF TEACHERS

California's Learning to Teach credential system includes routes to obtain a Preliminary and Clear California Credential. The North Coast Teacher Induction Program (NCTIP) provides services to all teachers, with a focus on teachers with the following types of credentials:

- ✓ Intern Credential (Support & Supervision with partner universities)
- ✓ Be a Teacher Intern Program with North Coast School of Education at SCOE
- ✓ General Education Preliminary Credential
- ✓ Education Specialist Credential (Special Education)
- ✓ Designated Subjects Credential (Career Technical Education – CTE and/or Adult Education)



Intern Credential

Interns are teachers who are employed, but have not obtained a Preliminary Teaching Credential. They have a Bachelor's Degree, have passed CBEST, have met subject matter competency, and meet NCLB requirements. They have not completed student teaching, but are enrolled in a University Intern Program. Special education teachers who already have a Multiple or Single Subject teaching credential also qualify as Interns. Interns complete CCTC credential requirements in their university Intern Program and the NCTIP provides Interns with a local Support Provider for required, ongoing support and supervision services.

Be a Teacher Intern Credential Program

The two-year "Be a Teacher" Intern Program combines practical, relevant coursework with on-site support provided through a collaborative partnership between the North Coast School of Education and each participating school district. We recognize that our candidates bring a wealth of experiences to the program and have designed our courses to link educational theory with best instructional practices. Our teachers are employed as Intern teachers during the day and attend credential classes two days a week on evenings or weekends while receiving ongoing coaching from an on-site mentor, course instructors, and practicum supervisors. All candidates in the Intern Program must meet the same standards for teacher preparation as those found in a traditional college or university setting. This includes the demonstration of subject matter proficiency and completion of all prerequisites and coursework

General Education Preliminary Credential

Teachers holding a Multiple Subject or Single Subject Preliminary Credential (including teachers prepared out of state or out of country) complete a State-approved Teacher Induction Program to obtain a California Clear Credential. The NCTIP Induction program provides situated learning professional development to meet the CCTC requirements and candidates are paired with local mentors for ongoing support services.

Education Specialist Credential

Preliminary Education Specialist Credential holders may participate in the NCTIP-approved Induction Program **or** a University-based program to obtain their California Clear Credential. Education Specialist teachers develop Individual Learning Plans specially designed to meet their unique needs, are paired with a local mentor, and are provided with additional support services to meet credential requirements.

Designated Subjects Credential – Career Technical Ed and/or Adult Ed Teachers

Teachers who hold a Preliminary Career Technical Ed or Adult Ed Credentials and are seeking to obtain a Level 1 and/or Clear Credential participate in the NCTIP two-year approved program to meet all of their credential requirements. They attend professional development seminars to meet the CCTC requirements and are paired with a local mentor for ongoing support services.
