The North Coast School of Education's (NCSOE) *Permit Holders Professional Development Series* offers partnering Districts assistance in meeting the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing requirements for supporting and supervising teachers who hold a PIP or STSP and their Mentors. While NCSOE provides Professional Development, Districts are responsible for supporting the Permit Holder with subject matter training.

Permit Holder and Mentor Orientation

NCSOE provides an orientation for Permit Holders and their Mentors. This initial meeting will provide an overview of California's Learning to Teach System, requirements for maintaining a PIP/STSP, and the *Permit Holder Professional Development Series*.

Foundations of Teaching

Permit Holders will complete four online foundational modules to assist PIP and STSP holders in developing their professional efficacy.

These modules include:

- Organizing the Classroom
- Classroom Management
- Planning and Organizing Instruction
- Curriculum and Instruction

Mentoring The Pre-Service Teacher

Mentors of Permit Holders collaborate with Mentors from the *Intern Support and Supervision Program* to develop their understanding of research-based strategies specific to supporting the needs of pre-service teachers:

- Mentoring the Pre-Service Teacher (Orientation)
- Designing a Personalized Plan that Leads to Subject-Matter Competence
- Creating and Maintaining Support Structures for All Students
- Exploring the Value of Reflection and Ongoing Professional development

Fee for Service: \$2500

Includes Mentor Stipend. Does not include cost for Subject Matter Training.

Subject Matter Training

Each individual hired on a permit must complete a minimum of 20 hours of District supported training in the foundational subject of the permit. Options for subject matter training include:

- State, county office, district, or site-level workshops, trainings or seminars;
- California Subject Exams for Teachers (CSET) tutorial sessions;
- Passage of subject matter CSET; and/or
- College or university foundational subject matter course or summer boot camp

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
